The Gabriel Project, at the woman's initiation, establishes a personal relationship, providing mentoring, friendship, emotional, and spiritual support. Working with other social service agencies, Gabriel Project volunteers advocate for the women and families they support, assisting them in obtaining housing, education, and material resources they need. Throughout her time with the Gabriel Project, Phyllis has been a highly valued contributor to our efforts in Wooster and Wayne County. produced comprehensive written updates, and routinely offers verbal input during our meetings to discuss the women we are assisting, either as a formal presentation or thoughtful suggestions.
